COMESA Vision on AGRIC AND NR

- Under Article 123 of the Treaty, COMESA member states have agreed to cooperate in the management of natural resources in the following ways
- CAADP
- 4 Pillars of CAADP
- EAP
- Aims to contribute to the improvement of environmental conditions in Africa in order to contribute to the achievement of economic growth and poverty eradication



The COMESA Logic

Agriculture:

- Lead sector for overall growth in Africa
- Most important form of land use in Sub-Saharan Africa
- Significant pressures on land use and livelihoods
- Driven by human and natural threats

Climate Change:

- Intensifies and speeds up these pressures
- Adds a new dimension of variability and change
- Driven by human and natural threats

Frameworks and Tools

Measurement & Monitoring: Development and deployment of an advanced methodology for measuring and monitoring carbon sequestration. *Funding secured*

Best Practice: Development and deployment of a "toolbox" of best practices for sustainable agriculture, land management and related livelihood strategies

Institutions & Policy: Capacity-building for creating the institutional and policy reforms necessary to support carbon finance.

Climate Working Group: Established under the auspices of the African Union and NEPAD to promote African interests in international climate negotiations

Portfolio Development: Staff assigned to member countries to source and develop carbon sequestration projects *Funding in-process*

Carbon Financial Facility: Design and develop an institutional structure to support carbon finance for agriculture and land-use projects in Eastern and Southern Africa *In development*
